

BGCS College Credit Plus FAQs:

1. **If a student takes a college course will it replace the required high school class?** Under The College Credit Plus, any college course in a given subject will by definition satisfy a high school graduation requirement. When an institution of higher education admits a student, they are certifying that the student has the prerequisite high school-level academic skills needed to be successful in that college course.
2. **Can a student go to two different colleges for two different classes?** Yes, a student may enroll into two different colleges for classes.
3. **How many college course hours can a middle school student take?** College Credit Plus allows high school/middle school students to earn college credit and apply that credit toward their high school graduation requirements. Successful completion of a three or more credit-hour college course will result in 1.0 Carnegie unit earned at the high school. A two credit-hour college course will earn students $\frac{2}{3}$ of a high school credit and a one credit-hour college course will convert to $\frac{1}{3}$ of a high school credit.
4. **Do students have to submit a letter of intent for dual enrollment?** Dual enrollment classes are considered a part of the College Credit Plus program, therefore a letter of intent is required.
5. **Will you be adding more dual enrollment courses for 2016-2017 school year or the 2017-2018 school year?** We do not have any other dual enrollment courses set to be added for next year. If families would like a current dual enrollment class list, please contact Mr. Hackenburg at BGHS.
6. **Is the SAT or ACT test required for students not in 11-12th grade?** The SAT and ACT test are not a requirement for enrollment with the College Credit Plus program.
7. **What if I am unable to make class?** You will be expected to follow the rules and regulations set by the college/university. You will also be expected to follow the rules and regulations set for high school students detailed in the student handbook.
8. **What universities and colleges offer the College Credit Plus program?** For the Northwest Ohio region the following universities and colleges participate in the College Credit Plus Program:
